The Farming and agricultural projects implemented in Umzimkulu Diocese and developed in partnerships with church members and LIMA rural Foundation is a very fruitful programme. Thanks to the work of Fundiswa Molefe- Siyabhabha Trust/Umzimkulu Diocese Development Organisation agricultural facilitator, 118 project members have improved their technical skills in farming and developed market linkages with local suppliers to sell their surplus. 

<u>Programme</u> <u>Pilot Mentor Mother</u>

The ECD programme is currently running a pilot Mentor Mother programme (home visiting programme that targets vulnerable children from 0-6 years) in Dundee working with Operation Sukuma Sakhe an upliftment initiative of the KZN provincial government. The Yakhumndeni Mentor Mother programme is working in partnership with the Yakhumndeni Programme which is based in the Holy Rosary Cathedral Parish in Dundee. 21 mentor mothers were

appointed after their training was completed by the Philani Child Health and Nutrition Project in October 2012. The programme was implemented on 12th



November 2012 and we currently have 179 expectant mothers and 74 malnourished infants registered on the programme. The programme is funded the DG Murray Trust.

The centre-based ECD programme (preschools and creches) is providing technical support to the survey that is being started in the Pretoria Archdiocese and supporting the handover of a preschool from a religious congregation to the local community in the Tzaneen Diocese.
